Principal's Report:

- Curriculum: Strong Teacher focus on Bridges implementation
 - Focus and Purpose of Bridges Math Curriculum
- Data: Roll-out of Renaissance & Schoolzilla Data Platforms
 - STAR Assessments are a new data tool that provides robust data on students in ELA and Math
 - Nearpod component of Renaissance (identifies and provides support for identified student needs)
 - Schoolzilla: data dashboard that will allow us to see all aspects of a student, including STAR assessments, attendance, MCAS, BAS data
- Culture: Finley the Fox, the PTO Halloween dance, the welcome back BBQ in August

Discussion:

- Renaissance Platform
 - Discussion of Renaissance Star Assessments and connection to classroom academic content.
 - Assessments are benchmarks and only one data point.
 - We are continuing to use BAS reading assessments.
 - Questions and answers were discussed regarding how teachers use data to make instructional decisions to meet student needs.
 - Teacher use of data is a best practice for driving instruction.
 - The past few interrupted school years have shown that, in general, our students continue to do very well. Reading and writing skills are always a priority and this data will guide instruction as we ensure that all students are becoming proficient.
 - The frequency of testing was discussed.
 - Three times a year for BAS and STAR, CBMs for grades K-2
- Specialists' Report (Leah Cullinane Art):

- We are staying unified and positive, and some staff changes. But we loved the in-person Back-to-School Night. Coming off the pandemic has been different since it caused some of us (Leah, for example) to change curriculum.
- Special Education Report (Jen How):
